



**AN ORDINANCE TO DEFINE THE SCOPE OF POLICE SERVICES WITHIN  
THE TOWN LIMITS AND THE EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION  
OF THE TOWN OF PINE LEVEL**

**DEFINITIONS:**

1. N.C.G.S. 160A-285 As a peace officer, a policeman shall have within the corporate limits of the city all the powers invested in law-enforcement officers by statute or common law. He shall also have power to serve all civil and criminal process that may be directed to him by any officer of the General Court of Justice and may enforce the ordinances and regulations of the city as the council may direct.
2. N.C.G.S. 160A-286 In addition to their authority within the corporate limits, city policemen shall have all the powers invested in law-enforcement officers by statute or common law within one mile of the corporate limits of the city, and on all property owned by or leased to the city wherever located.
3. N.C.G.S. 160A-286 Any officer pursuing an offender outside the corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction of the city shall be entitled to all of the privileges, immunities, and benefits to which he would be entitled if acting within the city, including coverage under the workmen's compensation laws.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF PINE LEVEL** that the Chief of Police and Officers of the Pine Level Police Department are hereby authorized:

1. To enforce the criminal and vehicle laws of the State of North Carolina in the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction of the Town of Pine Level.
2. To answer calls for service which have originated from within the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction and are received from E-911 communications.
3. To answer calls for service received from E-911 communications within the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction without charging a fee.

4. To respond to traffic collisions in the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction for the purpose of determining injury status of the occupants of the vehicles or other parties of the collision and to provide traffic control until the North Carolina State Highway Patrol or other jurisdiction arrives on scene.

5. To take other police action as appropriate.
